Are services available at school?

Yes. Students with identified support needs may have the opportunity to attend therapy sessions during the school day.

Will services disrupt class time?

Yes, but sessions are intended to be as minimally disruptive to the student's class schedule as possible.

Are services only available during the school year?

No. Clarvida therapists are available throughout the school year and summer break.

How does Clarvida work with parents or guardians?

Families are supported and encouraged to participate in treatment regularly through treatment planning and joint sessions to transfer skills for use in the home and community.

How does consent work?

Parent or guardian involvement is part of the process. Children 13 years and younger require a legal guardian to consent to services. Children 14 and older may consent on their own. Depending on the situation, appropriate permissions or releases may be needed for services and coordination.

How does Clarvida work with schools?

We work collaboratively with school teams to support students in a familiar setting and help services fit into the school day as smoothly as possible.

What can schools expect from Clarvida?

Schools can expect a collaborative partner that values clear communication, simple referral steps, and follow-up throughout the process.
